Safer & Accessible Fairfield

Over the past few month, Fairfield Village Community Association have been lobbying to make the roads through the village safer and more accessible for pedestrians. The Association is looking for realistic solutions that have minimal unintended consequences.

At the request of the Community Association the County Council carried out traffic monitoring over a 9-day period in May. The survey found that the average speed between St. Mark's Church and the entrance to the Recreation Ground averaged approximately 30 mph, with a number of vehicles exceeding 36 mph each hour.



Police Inspector Corteen attended June's Community Association meeting and heard from residents the issues that they face with vehicles exceeding the speed limit and cars parked blocking pedestrian access, forcing people to walk on a road that the County Council has described as "busy and, at times, dangerous".

During June and July, West Mercia Police carried out some speed checks along Stourbridge Road (outside the Village Hall, the Shop and at the junction with Swan Lane) and on one occasion stopping 9 vehicles out of just over 50 between 6pm and 6.30pm.

Inspector Corteen has informed the Community Association that Fairfield is one of her [speed check] priorities and officers will be deployed when resources are available.

Richard Clewer, Senior Highways Liaison Engineer, Worcestershire County Council, met up with the Association in June and has proposed, subject to funding, a number of measures to slow traffic:

- Timers to be fitted to the 20 mph school advisory signs;
- Mini-island to be re-painted;
- Missing bollard (mini-island) to be replaced;
- 30 mph roundels on the road to be re-painted;

- White lines to be painted on the road at the entrance to the village to give the impression of a pinch point;
- New signage to be erected Senior Citizen warning triangle and T-junction sign near Wood Lane.
- Small 30 mph signs throughout the village.

The Community Association will monitor the effectiveness of these measures.

Parking in the village is limited and finding a solution is not easy. The Community Association is aware of a number of near-miss incidents with cars exiting the Village Hall and impassible footpaths requiring elderly pedestrians and residents with mobility issues to have to walk on the road.

The County Council have, so far, proposed:

- "Think Before You Park" signs; and
- Enforceable "Keep Clear" bus stop area to be painted on the road (bus stop on the side of the road near Shop).

The Community Association have proposed to the Parish Council the extension of the Recreation Ground carpark by six car spaces, creating 12 car spaces. The Parish Council have agreed to obtain quotes, hard standing and matting, and once received will consider the Association's proposal.

Drivers of vehicles are asked not to obstruct views from driveways and to ensure that space is left on footpaths to accommodate a wheel chair or a double children's buggy.

The Community Association has received the following update from Steven Aldridge, Principal Planner, Worcestershire County Council:

The County Council have received approximately 215 responses to the 2nd Consultation that ended 15th July.

Over 150 responses were received during the first consultation in 2013.

Due to the volume of documents submitted and consultation responses received the earliest meeting of the Planning Committee to discuss the application will be in November, they are hoping December at the latest.

The County Council will have a better idea of when this application will be placed on the Planning Committee agenda in early October.
