#### Message from The Lord-Lieutenant



#### **Recycling Reminder**

Bromsgrove District Council are reminding residents not to put their recycling in bin bags or carrier bags. Bags and their contents are rejected at the Recycling Processing Centre.

Place items for recycling in the green bin and take any old carrier bags to your local supermarket, where they can be recycled.

Non-black plant pots can be placed in Recycling Bin. Black plant pots can be taken to Webbs Garden Centre.

#### Wood Lane

A blocked gully in Wood Lane has been reported to Worcestershire County Council. The reported gully does not appear on their system and we are waiting for a contractor to undertake a site visit.

#### Swan Lane Update

The Community Association has received the following update from Rachel Benson, Highways & Transport Control Centre Manager at Worcestershire County Council regarding the ongoing work to clear gullies along Swan Lane:

"With regard to Swan Lane, this is a typical rural road in Worcestershire. There is a drainage issue in the 'dip' and it appears that the problem lies with the ditch (where the system discharges into). We needed permission from Cadent Gas to do work as there is a pipeline nearby and this resulted in a delay. We are now focussing on drainage schemes and this location is, and always has been, included on the programme as an interim project. As with all drainage/flooding work, our priority is always flooded property (houses) or where principal roads are affected. In the case of Swan Lane, the A491 runs parallel with it and so there is an alternative, suitable route. It is therefore not a high priority but, of course, we continue to monitor for any changes.

It is sometimes the case that gulley lids cannot be lifted because of salt, but that does not necessarily mean that there is or will be a problem. Gullies that appear blocked (for example along the Stourbridge Road) can still be working effectively despite evidence of weeds/debris. We are not aware of flooding or ponding water on this carriageway. There was some initial confusion where our contractor advised us that the work on Stourbridge Road had been completed and this was not the case; I can only apologise for this. Where this happens, we always examine lessons learned to minimise such events reoccurring."

Since receiving this update, the Community Association have identified and reported two additional drainage grids that had been hidden by mud and other debris.

At the time of writing, FVCA was unaware when required work will take place.

#### Appeal to Dog Walkers

Please do not leave dog waste bags on the side of paths and roads, to be

picked up later, whilst you walk your dog.

Some people have the good intention to pick up their dog waste bags when the make the return journey, unfortunately people often forget. This bag was left on the side of Wood Lane, after three hours it was removed by a FVCA volunteer.



#### Wood Lane Fly-tipping

Bromsgrove District Council and the Community Association have received several complaints regarding residents dumping garden waste in the hedge along Wood Lane.

Bromsgrove District Council placed "No Tipping" signage along Swan Lane in late July, two days later more grass & hedge cuttings had dumped in the hedge.

Residents are reminded that dumping garden waste is fly tipping and, apart from being illegal, can be harmful to wildlife and, if blown into neighbouring fields, livestock.

Please use a home composter or the Brown Wheelie Bin service from Bromsgrove District Council.



#### **Cutting Down Cuts My Risk**

Public Health England have launched a major new adult health campaign to seize the opportunity for a national reset moment. Better Health will help capture the imagination of the nation, using this unique moment in time to help kick start our health – to eat better and get active. COVID-19 has affected the whole country; for almost everyone, life has had to fundamentally change. But it has also prompted many people to reflect and think more seriously about their health. What's more, people have been surprised by how able they have been to change their behaviour, with lockdown showing many that they are able to make and sustain changes to their lives.

The Better Health campaign will initially support individuals on their weight loss journey, but, later down the line, will also provide advice and support for quitting smoking, drinking less and looking after your mental health.

Nearly two thirds (63%) of adults in the UK are overweight or living with obesity. Gaining weight is often a gradual process that takes place over a number of years and modern life doesn't always make it easy. But this extra weight causes pressure to build up around vital organs, making it harder for the body to fight against diseases like cancer, heart disease and now COVID-19.

By reducing your weight within a healthy range, you can help cut your risk of being critically ill with COVID19. To improve health and wellbeing, individuals should aim to have a BMI below 25 and above 18.5. The National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) recommends that Black, Asian and minority ethnic groups (BAME) should aim to have a BMI below 23 and above 18.5 to avoid risks to health.

To support people to live healthier lives, the brand-new Better Health webpage will be available at nhs.uk/BetterHealth. It provides tools to help people manage their weight loss – from checking their BMI, to getting access to free support tools including the NHS 12-week weight loss plan. The NHS 12-week weight loss plan, available both online and via a new app, promotes

evidence based safe and sustainable weight loss. It helps users to make healthier choices, by providing the most up to date evidence based healthy eating and physical activity advice in a magazine format that enables them to keep track of their calorie intake, portions of fruit and veg, physical activity level and teaches skills to prevent weight gain. There will also be exclusive offers from other well-known weight management providers to offer further support.

Later down the line, support will also be made available to help people quit smoking and look after their mental health. With the Better Health tools www.nhs.uk/BetterHealthpeople can live well and set goals, see progress and feel a real difference on their weight loss journey.

#### Are you seeing foreign lottery mailings?

In recent months, Royal Mail have effectively banned scam mail including foreign lottery mailings. The National Trading Standards (NTS) Scams Team's Investigators are keen to see how these criminals will adapt to the new changes. Scam mail (including fraudulent foreign lottery tickets) has been added to the list of prohibited items. This now allows Royal Mail to manage fraudulent or misleading or "exaggerated" material posted from abroad that seek to solicit payments. This is great news for the many people that are still receiving these fraudulent mailings. The NTS team are assuming that the foreign lottery mailings will start to slow down. However, these criminal individuals/companies will try to find a way into the country through other means. If you are still receiving mailings of this type then please send them into the team, to freepost NTSST, FREEPOST, MAIL MARSHALS for investigation.

#### Items for sale must be:

- Displayed safely and, where possible,
- Cleaned and disinfected.
- Safe; no safety critical items (e.g. crash helmets, baby products and car seats) and no electrical items unless PAT tested.

#### Participating households:

- Must provide hand sanitiser;
- **Ensure** social distancing;
- Must confirm that they have appropriate public liability insurance (check home insurance policies);
- **Should** be mindful of possible criminal activity, especially if displaying high value items or leaving items unattended.

FVCA Insurers (Zurich) have remined us of our legal responsibilities, members of the FVCA Committee will visit participating properties to ensure that the

rules stated on the Household Registration Form are being adhered to.

#### **Parking**

Visitors to our community will be able to park in the Village Hall car park.

Should vehicles parked be elsewhere, we ask that motorists are considerate to residents and

not to obstruct pedestrians and traffic flow.



#### Village Hall Subsidence

In late Summer 2018 cracks were spotted in the wall (front right hand side) at the Village Hall, and the Hall insurers were notified. They arranged for a Structural Engineer to visit the Hall who confirmed that the cracks were the result of subsidence. After some investigation, which involved soil samples being taken and analysed, the conclusion was reached by the Insurers that the cause was soil shrinkage due to roots of the nearby trees. Over the past 18 months, monthly monitoring of the cracks has taken place by appointed specialists and further movement has been observed.

The Village Hall trustees understand that discussions are now taking place between the Insurers, Bromsgrove District Council and the owner of the adjacent land as to what tree works maybe necessary to prevent further damage to property.

At this point in time, we have been given no indication as to when the repairs to the Hall will commence.

#### **Broadband To Get Faster**

Full Fibre – Fibre to the Premises (FTTP) – is on its ways to properties that are connected to the Mount Road junction.

Over the past few months, contractors on behalf of BT Openreach have been unblocking and preparing underground pipes.

Firm dates are unknown, we understand that BT Openreach will be laying the fibre this Autumn. Initially the fibre will be laid from the Mount Road junction, through the underground pipes to telegraph poles near peoples' properties. Eventually, the fibre will continue to properties, so there will be no need for the currently copper wiring. At this stage we do not know what the arrangements will be to get fibre between the telegraph pole and property.

#### The Reels Roll at Fairfield Flicks

**Fairfield Flicks will restart in September.** Due to Covid-19, our Booking and Visitor Instructions have changed. For the safety of all and in compliance with Government guidance and good practice:

- Pre-book to avoid disappointment using the TicketLab box office, the
  box office link can be found on the page detailing each film on the
  Fairfield Flicks website (<u>www.fairfieldflicks.org.uk</u>). Door sales will be
  possible for any unsold tickets. To reduce cash handling, payment by
  card will be accepted. Audience numbers will be limited to 27 people.
- You must not enter the Village Hall if you or anyone in your household has COVID-19 symptoms.
- On arrival you will be asked to provide your contact details, these will
  be held for 21 days following the film screening and your information
  will only be used for the purpose of and shared with Test, Track and
  Trace.
- If you develop COVID-19 symptoms within 7 days of visiting these premises alert Test, Track and Trace and contact Fairfield Flicks, admin@fvca.org.uk.
- Maintain 2 metres social distancing as far as possible. Chairs will be spaced 2 metres apart.
- Use the hand 17anitizer provided on entering the premises. Clean your hands often. Soap and paper towels are provided.
- Avoid touching your face, nose, or eyes. Clean your hands if you do.
- "Catch it, Bin it, Kill it". Tissues should be disposed of into one of the rubbish bins.
- Face coverings are to be worn. It will be a legal requirement for face coverings to be worn in Community Centres, Cinemas and other buildings from 8<sup>th</sup> August.
- Wash your clothes when you get home to reduce risk of transmission.
- **Cushions are permitted**, for personal comfort only.
- Whilst we establish our Covid-Safe regime, no refreshments will be on sale.

#### The Zookeeper's Wife

Horrified by the treatment of their fellow citizens in the city's newly formed ghettos, Antonina and Jan begin covertly working with Polish resistance forces by smuggling hundreds of displaced Jews into their zoo and providing them with shelter and a place to hide. However, with the Nazi's new chief zoologist Lutz Heck (Brühl) making daily visits and becoming increasingly suspicious of their behaviour, the Zabinskis are forced to go to extreme lengths to continue to protect their secret.

#### **TV Streaming Scams**

There continues to be a large number of reports regarding scams that aim to defraud people out of their money by phoning consumers and telling them that their TV subscription is coming to an end and that they would have to pay in order to keep this service.

The usual method is that you will receive an automated phone call stating that your subscription is about to expire and that you need to make payment of £39.99. It will then ask you to press a number on your telephone keypad in order to be put through to an operator to make payment. We have also had reports of being contacted directly (no automated message) by quite convincing operators. This is a scam.

Amazon will never ask for your personal information, or ask you to make a payment outside of its website (e.g. payments over the phone, emailing card details, via bank transfer etc..)

Netflix will never ask for your personal information over email. This includes: credit card number, bank account details and your password. They will never request payments via a third party vendor or website.

If you have a TV subscription, then please check the company's website for advice on how to deal with any suspicious contact that you receive and always report to Action Fraud either online or by phoning 0300 123 2040.
