Spoof Amazon Emails

Action Fraud has received several reports from victims who have been sent convincing looking emails claiming to be from Amazon. The spoofed emails from "service@amazon.co.uk" claim recipients have made an order online and mimic an automatic customer email notification.

The scam email claims recipients have ordered an expensive vintage chandelier. Other reported examples include: Bose stereos, iPhone's and luxury watches.

The emails cleverly state that if recipients haven't authorised the transaction they can click on the help centre link to receive a full refund. The link leads to an authentic-looking website, which asks victims to confirm their name, address, and bank card information.

Amazon says that suspicious e-mails will often contain:

- Links to websites that look like Amazon.co.uk, but aren't Amazon.co.uk.
- Attachments or prompts to install software on your computer.
- Typos or grammatical errors.
- Forged (or spoofed) e-mail addresses to make it look like the e-mail is coming from Amazon.co.uk.

Amazon will never ask for personal information to be supplied by e-mail.



Kimber's Men: Singing Up A Storm

Kimber's Men visit Fairfield Village Hall on Saturday 25th March and are probably the finest exponents of sea songs and sea shanties in the UK, and travel all over the British Isles and to Europe singing their songs. They have performed on the BBC with Gareth Malone and have twice featured on Channel 4's Sunday Brunch.

Kimber's Men sing mostly a capella sea songs and sea shanties, which are delivered with power and enthusiasm, each member taking his turn at leading a particular song. Their members also play a variety of instruments which include banjo, guitars, harmonium low whistle, bodhran and occasionally English bagpipes.

The show is delivered with the full enjoyment of the audience in mind and is both humorous and musical.

A beautifully crafted mixture of standards, obscurities and shanty inspired originals, penned by members of the band.

Their song about the Penlee lifeboat disaster, 'Don't take the heroes', is highly acclaimed and is covered by many shanty bands.

Tickets will be on sale from mid-February and can be purchased from Alice Raybould (Glovers Meadow Farm) & from Fairfield's Village Shop, adults £9.00, children £7.00. The show starts at 6.30pm.
