

# The Importance and Measurement of pH in your Garden or Allotment

The first meeting of 2019 by West Midlands District Association (DA) of the National Vegetable Society (NVS) will be at Fairfield Village Hall on Thursday 28 February. The hall will be open 7.00 pm with Free Tea/Coffee.

The Meeting will commence at 8.00 pm with a brief report on last year's progress and an update of the plans and programme for 2019 which includes the DA hosting the display at Gardeners World Live at the NEC June 13th-16th. and the Annual Show Thursday 29 August.

The main event of the evening is a Presentation by Richard Baldwin, RHS Masters on The Importance and Measurement of pH Richard is a member of the NVS and regularly attends our meetings.

He comes from the West Riding of Yorkshire and has been involved in horticulture all his life, beginning in a general nursery, progressing to the parks department glasshouses and nursery. After a period on the south coast growing indoor flowers and pot plants he moved to the research station at Luddington on commercial fruit crop production. Richard began his teaching career at Pershore College of Horticulture, specialising in commercial horticulture also running a 50 acre intensive vegetable unit and an organic unit, he holds position of Senior Horticultural Lecturer.

Members and Visitors can bring a Soil Sample for testing and there will be a demonstration using a BDH soil kit; all attendees can receive an electronic pH reading of their samples.

To collect a soil sample select an area of the garden or several crop rotation areas from the allotment, using a garden trowel, take ten samples from the area, about a trowel full each, down to a depth of 15cm (6 inches). Mix all ten samples together thoroughly, breaking up any large lumps. Put a cupful of the mixed soil in a suitable container. label and bring to the meeting, together with a small glass jar, an old teaspoon and some paper towels. Calculate site area in m2. Bring a calculator. Lime calculations will be undertaken.

New Members, Visitors or anyone interested in growing vegetables are always welcome to attend. For Visitors there is a £3 admission fee which includes Tea/Coffee and Biscuits.

### Vehicle Crime

A fraudulent text is doing the rounds purporting to be from DVLA saying you have a vehicle tax refund, DO NOT click on link to process the refund. IT IS A FRAUD - IGNORE & DELETE THE TEXT

## Message From West Mercia Police – 999 Calls

"In 2018 we had almost 12,500 accidental/silent 999 calls, such as pocket dials or children playing with phones for example. We have to check that you are ok and do not require police and this takes valuable time. If you do accidentally dial 999, DON'T PANIC AND STAY ON THE LINE".

### **Operation Lollipop**

Members of the public in Bromsgrove, Rubery, Alvechurch, Wythall and Hagley are now able to send digital photographs of dangerous or inconsiderate parking outside schools directly to their Safer Neighbourhood Teams via a dedicated email address -

<u>OperationLollipop@westmercia.pnn.police.uk</u> Officers will then investigate and make contact with the registered keeper to take appropriate action where possible.

### The Telephone Preference Service

The Telephone Preference Service (TPS) is a free service enabling individuals to register their wish not to receive unsolicited sales and marketing telephone calls.

Those that can register on the TPS include consumers at their residential address, sole traders and, except in Scotland, partnerships.

Organisations with which you have an ongoing relationship, for example those who regard you as a customer, (or in the case of charities - a donor) may well gather your consent during the early stages of your relationship with them and will therefore be entitled to call you even if your number is registered on TPS (unless you have previously told them specifically that you object to them calling you for marketing purposes).

The TPS can accept the registration of mobile telephone numbers, however it is important to note that this will prevent the receipt of marketing voice calls but not SMS (text) messages. If you wish to stop receiving SMS marketing messages, please send an 'opt-out' request to the company involved.

As TPS registration only prevents marketing calls, organisations will still be able to call you for the purposes of genuine market research.

Unfortunately, TPS are unable to stop calls originating from outside the United Kingdom.
