Volunteer and Community Tree Planting to Extend Pepper Wood

Pepper Wood is an ancient and hugely valuable community woodland, a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) and has an exceptional diversity of trees and shrubs as well as a number of rare and uncommon flowering plants.

Thanks to the support of the community and successful fundraising Pepper Wood has recently been extended and work has begun to transform it into a new haven for wildlife. Through a combination of natural regeneration and carefully thought-out tree planting this land will establish a new landscape creating 250 acres of continuous, resilient native woodland.

To help with this ambitious target, the Woodland Trust held several planting days in December and invited a range of volunteers to plant new native trees. The planting team included volunteers from the local community and staff from Lloyds Bank who partner with the Woodland Trust to help reduce the impact of climate change across the UK. There was also an enthusiastic team of children from Fairfield First School who between them managed to plant 100 trees. Headmaster Scott Smith felt it was a great experience for the children saying

‘It was a wonderful experience for our children to be involved in. Pepperwood is an area that we use, as a learning resource, regularly throughout the year, so is well loved by our children and their families. We were delighted to be able to help with such an ambitious project that will change our local environment forever. We look forward to continuing our visits and watching the area develop.’

The site manager for Pepper Wood, Paul Jarczewski, knows that Woodland Trust have big plans for the site and in the coming years hopes to create new habitats, increase the bio-diversity and give the community a valuable area of green space.

‘With the help of local people we have kick-started the creation of our new native wood next to Pepper Wood. During this planting event we managed to plant 2500 trees. We hope as the wood develops it will eventually become as interesting and diverse as Pepper Wood itself, and make a lasting contribution in our fight against climate change and nature loss.’

Returning to Fairfield Flicks, after wowing the audience in 2022, is **Anne-Marie Allen**, a Birmingham-based singer-songwriter with a distinct vocal tone which captivates audiences who enjoy soul, funk, folk, and blues with a hint of tribal, punk, and psychedelic! Anne-Marie's unique musical style does not confine itself to one specific genre. Her lyrics are honest about the human condition, yet her music has an upbeat vibe to keep audiences smiling.



Anne-Marie's songs tell stories of freedom, capitalism, and human connection, presenting a lucid lyrical landscape with percussive guitar rhythms. Anne-Marie's debut EP "Intuition" was released in May 2018, presenting a fresh new tone to the original live music scene.

Over the years Anne-Marie has collaborated with a wide range of artists, DJ's, producers, and MC's, performing gigs in the UK and abroad across various venues in a professional capacity. Anne-Marie is currently performing her gigs with Dominic James Hyde on guitar, occasional brass, and wind sections.

Her track "Zombie Paradise" was added to the Brum radio A list in April 2018 and was also selected to be played as part of the up and coming artists promotion for unsigned artists on Nova Radio station. Following the success of "Zombie Paradise" this track in addition to her track "Vibe Attracts a Tribe," was instantly selected by BBC Introducing and was played during two consecutive weeks on BBC radio West Midlands.

In 2019 Anne-Marie's track "I Like" was strongly shortlisted and performed at Thame Town Music Festival's songwriting competition. The judges included a wide range of industry professionals such as John Leckie- Rock production Royalty who has worked with John Lennon, Paul McCartney, Pink Floyd and many more.

Help Keep Our Community Safe

Life's safer when you know your neighbours and the community pulls together.

If you see suspicious activity REPORT IT, online via <https://www.westmercia.police.uk> or telephone 101. If safe to do so, share your observations with us admin@fvca.org.uk so that we can make others aware.

What is Suspicious Activity?

If a vehicle/person feels out of place please report to the Police as suspicious activity, tel. 101. Even if something seems trivial to you, it's worth reporting as it could be important/vital information. Please remain vigilant at all times, and not just during any incident.

Cost of Living Scams

Criminals are still using the cost of living crisis to scam the public – do not become a victim. Action Fraud are encouraging members of the public to be extra vigilant against fraud, especially in sharing your personal and financial details with people you do not know. Do not let the fraudsters cash in on the cost of living crisis, and please make sure you share this message with any friends and family who may be more vulnerable.

Common scams that are still circulating right now include:

- Energy Bill Rebates
- Cost of Living Payments
- Fuel Vouchers, Phone Bill discounts and Supermarket offers
- Fake Investment opportunities

Also beware of Non-Delivery and Non-Payment Scams.

- Non-Delivery Scam means a buyer pays in advance for goods or services online but those items are never received

- Non-Payment Scam means the seller sends goods sold via an online sales site but the seller never gets paid

Remember that criminals are expert at gaining your confidence and impersonating Government Agencies, Utility companies, Businesses and the Police.

As stated before, If it looks too good to be true it probably is.

Always be aware, and do not let Fraudsters and Scammers ruin your life.

Internet Sales Scam

Reports of Internet Sales scams continue to appear and anyone selling items through Online or Social Media market places really needs to be aware of this problem.

How does it work?

- You, the seller will list an article for sale.
- The scammer will make contact and negotiate a price and will then appear to send the money, often through a WISE account.
- The scammer then tells the victim that, in order for the money to be released, a Tracking Number needs to be provided, but you cannot get a Tracking Number prior to sending the item
- Once a Tracking Number is provided, this confirms to the scammer the item is on the way in the post, and there is little to nothing Royal Mail or any courier company can do to retrieve the item.
- The money has in fact never been sent by the scammer in the first place, and so the victim takes a double loss: the loss of money from the sale AND the loss of the item.

How can you avoid being scammed?

1. Research the buyer before you enter into any agreement or monies change hands. Check the website for any reports about the buyer you are dealing with
2. Never dispatch any item you are selling before you have received the payment and it is secured.
3. Take care not to provide unnecessary personal details that may give the Scammer access to your finances. Avoid giving out personal bank details to private buyers you do not know.

Looking to save money on a holiday or break?

Criminals use fake websites, listings, emails, advertisements, social media posts, texts and phone calls to trick you into buying and paying for what you think is a genuine holiday. Whereas what you might actually get is a disappointed family and no chance of getting your money back.

How to avoid a scam!

- Always do your research into accommodation, flights, cruises, package holidays or pilgrimages to check they are authentic. Trust Pilot and check a website on Getsafeonline.org are good places to check.
- Be wary of unusually cheap holidays and flights or high deposits.
- Check terms and conditions prior to making any payment.
- Keep confirmations and payment receipts and check your bank and credit card statements for irregular entries.

If you have lost money to fraud, always report it immediately to your bank.

Take Five To Stop Fraud...

- **Stop:** Taking a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or information could keep you safe.
- **Challenge:** Could it be fake? It's okay to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you.
- **Protect:** If you think you've been a victim of fraud, contact your bank immediately and report it to Action Fraud online at actionfraud.police.uk or by calling 0300 123 2040.
